Objectives of the final thesis : The final thesis is the result of independent work by a student of basic academic studies, which : proves that he has mastered the knowledge and acquired the competencies necessary for independent work in a specific scientific or professional field of subjects studied within the study program. becomes familiar with a specific area of scientific or professional discipline through a more detailed elaboration of a topic from that area ; enables independent practical work in a specific area.			
Expected outcomes: With the final thesis, the student proves that he has the competence and that he has achieved the learning outcomes in solving problems in professional and scientific areas that were the content of the studies and that he/she is qualified to use the theoretical and practical knowledge acquired during the studies.			
General content : The final thesis represents the student's independent work in which he becomes familiar with the methodology of implementing professional work in the field of law. The final thesis contains: <i>title page, table of contents, introduction, main part, conclusion, literature.</i> The topic of the final work can be: Theoretical problem, application problem observed in literature or practice, theoretical-application problem, etc. The title page should contain basic information such as: in the header - the name of the higher education institution, in the middle section - the final thesis from (subject name), title of the thesis, candidate's name and index number, name of the teacher supervising the thesis, place and date of preparation (year of submission of the thesis). The table of contents lists the main parts through which the final thesis is structured (subheadings), as well as the page numbers on which these parts are located. The introductory part of the final paper should introduce the reader to the topic, present the importance of the topic and the reason why the student chose to address that particular topic, as well as an overview of the content that follows. In the main part of the final paper, the student discusses the topic of the paper. It contains a presentation of theoretical (basic definitions) and practical (illustrative examples) results related to the given topic. This part of the text should be structured through several logical units marked with appropriate titles and subtitles. In conclusion , the thesis presents the results that the student achieved through the preparation of the final thesis. The literature of the work includes all published sources: books, articles, magazines, proceedings, company reports, websites, etc.			
Execution methods : The student chooses a topic for the final thesis in agreement with the subject teacher - mentor from the list of approved topics. The final thesis is submitted in four copies. The three-member commission for the defense of the final thesis, consisting of teachers of the higher education institution, is appointed by the director upon the proposal of the mentor. The mentor is a mandatory member of the commission and must be a teacher of the subject in which the student is studying. The student is working on his/her final thesis. The defense of the student's final thesis is oral and public and is held on school premises.
