Familiarity with the basic concepts of competition law; familiarization with the characteristics of competition law and its importance; prevention of distortion of competition; application of competition law; competition policy; subjects of competition and institutional solutions; practical aspect of competition law and case law; acquisition of knowledge about competition in the market and its mechanisms for achieving economic efficiency; familiarization with forms of distortion of competition, through theoretical and practical aspects.			
Case outcome			
After completing the course, students are expected to have a better understanding of the field of competition law, as well as recognition of basic institutions in practice, developing awareness of compliance with competition law at both the national and supranational levels in terms of proper development and functioning of the market, as well as raising awareness of everyday forms of violation of regulations in this area, and knowledge of the means and goals for maintaining competition at the desired level.
